<p>At: 00 MS cars &amp; Apts</p> <p>In (01:03:16:09) Dur 7:00 + 2:00</p>	<p>The slide collapsed a parking lot next to four apartment buildings. It created a sinkhole that trapped several cars in the deep gorge.</p>
<p>At:09 Apartments</p> <p>In (01:04:00:15) Dur 7:00</p>	<p>Fire officials are worried the apartment complex might also tumble down the hill, so they ordered the evacuation.</p>
<p>AT :16 <b>SOT</b> full</p> <p>In (01:07:08:29) Out (01:07:20:02) Dur 11:03</p> <p>SUPER; Jeanette Carinio/Resident</p>	<p>SOUND UP: "We just grabbed...</p> <p>SOUND OUT: because we can't go in there."</p>
<p>At :27:04 Pan</p> <p>In (01:05:57:00) Dur 6:00</p>	<p>The cause of the slide is believed to be related to construction at the bottom of the hill.</p>
<p>At :33:04 steel beams</p> <p>In (01:06:16:00) Dur 8:00</p>	<p>Workers had driven steel beams to support the hill for a new condominium complex. But the effort didn't work.</p>
<p>At :41:04 Leaving</p> <p>In (01:06:36:19) Dur 10:00 + 5:00</p> <p>T.R.T. 56:04</p>	<p>And now many residents say they aren't sure they EVER want to return, even if the hill and their apartments are eventually declared safe.</p>
